- Smiley face or appropriate comment on our work.
- Highlighting our work in the classroom .
- Telling our parents after school when they collect us.
- An 'in class' system. Class Stars, points, beans etc
- Highlighting our work or behaviour in the Star assembly
- A visit to the Head
- Lunchtime supervisors in the dining room/playground also give out house points to children they spot being good role models.
- Lunchtime Stars awarded by Senior Midday Supervisor
- Disco's and parties.
